### Meeting & Conference Facilities

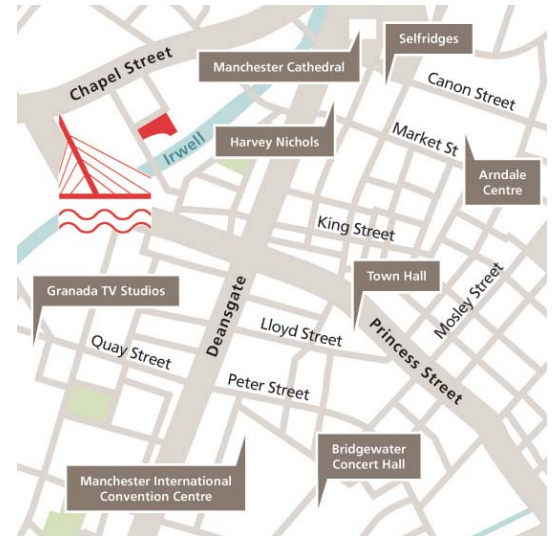
- Self-contained floor for conference and banqueting with dedicated entrance at street level

### Location

Fashionable Manchester hosts numerous festivals throughout the year, with international arts and culture in outstanding galleries and museums, vibrant theatre and music scenes, superb shopping and plenty of sports too. The city is home to a variety of architectural styles and surrounded by some of the UK's most beautiful countryside.

The Lowry Hotel is part of the Chapel Wharf development on the banks of the River Irwell on the central Salford-Manchester boundary. The main commercial, shopping, business and entertainment areas are within a few minutes' walk via Calatrava's landmark Trinity footbridge.

Located in the heart of one of the most comprehensive transport systems in Europe and serviced by one of the world's fastest growing airports, Manchester has developed into an epicentre of style and culture and is home to a wide variety of museums, heritage buildings, galleries and theatres.



### Directions

#### By Air

Manchester International Airport is approximately 25 minutes by car from the hotel.

#### By Train

Manchester's mainline train station is a 10-minute drive from the hotel.

#### By Car from Scotland

Follow route for Carlisle to join the M6. Turn off at junction 30, signposted M61. Follow signs for M60 and Liverpool M62. Continue for approximately three miles, following signs for M602 to Salford and Manchester. At the end, take the righthand lane signposted A57. \* Continue along the A57 for approximately two miles until you see the large Grosvenor Casino on the right. Turn left at the traffic lights on to Water Street; continue to the end. At the first major set of traffic lights turn right on to Chapel Street, signposted Chapel Wharf. Pass underneath the railway bridge and turn right into Dearmans Place, signposted The Lowry Hotel.

#### By Car from North Wales

Follow route to Chester, picking up the M56 for Manchester. Turn off at junction 9, signposted M6 North. Continue to junction 21a and follow signs for M62 Manchester. Continue on the M62 until junction 12, then take the M602 to Salford and Manchester. At the end, take the right-hand lane signposted A57. \*(as above)

#### By Car from the North-East of England

Follow the A1 South, picking up the M62 at Ferry Bridge, heading west. At junction 12 take the M602 to Salford and Manchester. At the end, take the right-hand lane signposted A57. \*(as above)

#### By Car from London and the South

Join the M25 and head north on the M1. At junction 19 take the signposted route for Birmingham. Follow signs for the M6 North to junction 21a, then follow signs for M62 Manchester. Continue on the M62 until junction 12, then take the M602 to Salford and Manchester. At the end, take the right-hand lane signposted A57. \*(as above)
